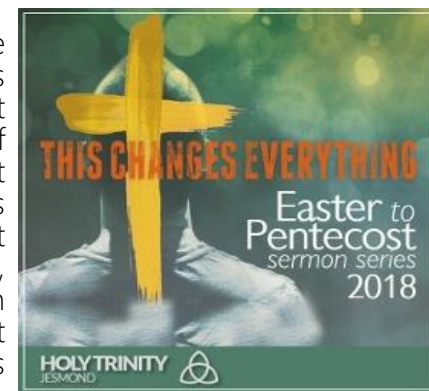
Throughout history, there have been significant mile markers that humanity points to saying, 'that changes everything!' There was fire; the invention of the wheel; the printing press; electricity; the internet, to name but a few.

Of course these are monumental events in human history, but we believe none of them is as significant as the life of Jesus Christ. So significant is Jesus' life, ministry, death, resurrection and ascension that our entire calendar is based on him. But

what makes Jesus so important? Above all, it was **his resurrection**; the empty tomb that was found on that first Easter morning. As the women entered the tomb, the angel says to them, 'He has risen!' These three words form the **greatest watershed** of all time. More than anything else in all of history, the resurrection of Jesus Christ 'changes everything!'

So over the seven weeks from **Easter to Pentecost** we follow the tumultuous events that follow on from the resurrection, seeing through the eyes of the gospel writers those moments that together capture the radical, hopeful and utterly transformational love and plans of God.
